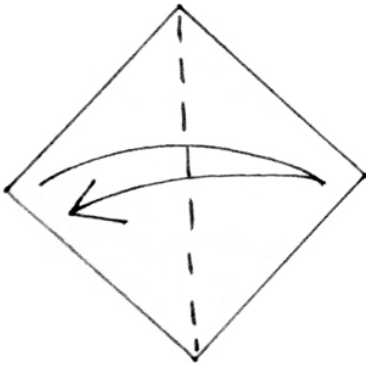
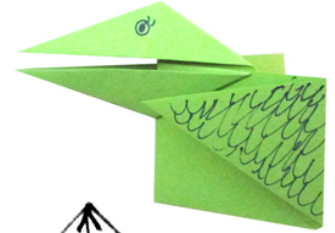
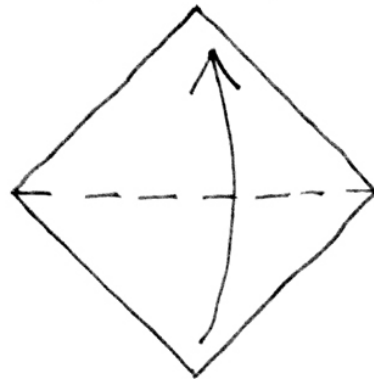


# “Pecking Pterosaur”

Traditional Model ~ Diagrams by Mary Ellen Palmeri



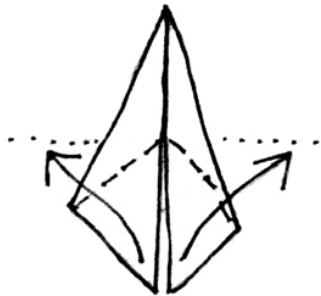
1. Fold & unfold diagonal (color that shows will become the lower beak; the rest will show the color that faces down in 1st step)



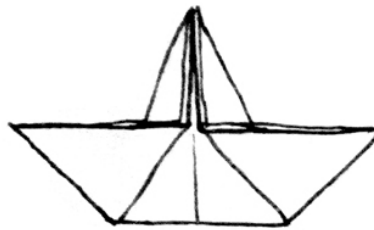
2. Fold in half, bottom to top



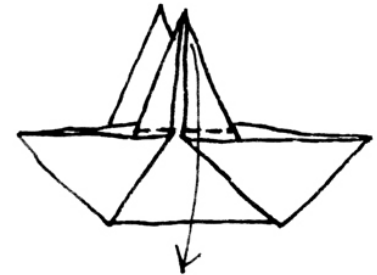
3. Fold side edges in & down to meet at the center crease; see next step for results



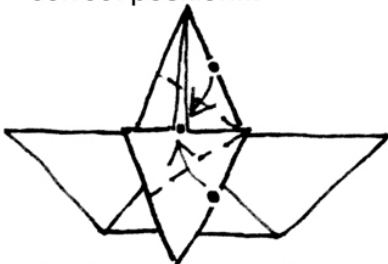
4. Fold flaps up & out so edges are parallel to the bottom edge; see next step for correct position...



5. There are two layers; open just enough to separate them and lift inside layer to the front; keep all folds in place. Check next step to see result



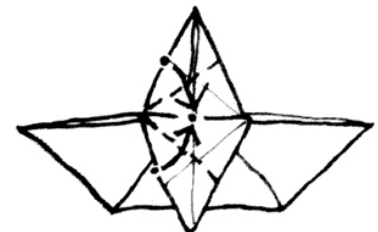
6. Fold front triangle flap down



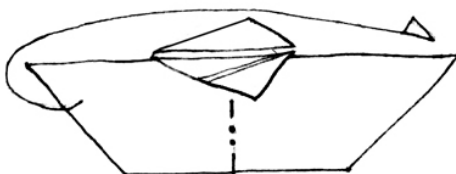
7. Fold each triangle flap sideways so the edges with dots (●) meet at the center. Crease sharply



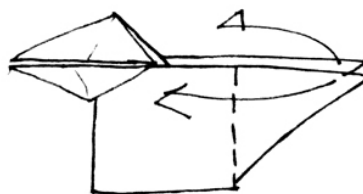
8. Unfold the flaps



9. Re-fold flaps in the opposite direction, again meeting at the center



10. Fold left side behind while releasing the ‘beaks’ to fold in half on the creases already made in steps 7 & 9. It helps if you pinch each beak in the center...see step 11 for result ↓



11. Fold over flaps to create wings



12. Folding is complete. Pull wings apart to activate the beak. Decorate as desired!
